

EMCC course



The EMCC (Emergency Medicine Core Competences) course is an intensive, simulation-based course in Emergency Medicine. Its aim is the development of competence in Emergency Medicine through intensive simulation-training and group discussion.

PARTICIPANTS

The course is designed for 24 participants (trainees, specialists and educators in Emergency Medicine).

COURSE DESCRIPTION & LEARNING OBJECTIVES

This 1.5-day course focuses on competence development through scenario-based training. The competences in focus are:

- 1-The initial management of critical patients in all age groups
- 2-Differential diagnosis and decision-making
- 3-Systematic ECG interpretation
- 4-Systematic acid-base interpretation
- 5-Interpretation of the neurological examination and initial management of selected neurological conditions

All participants are invited to fill in a pretest as a theoretical preparation for the course. All participants receive a course manual and pocket-sized checklist compendium covering:

- The initial management of > 30 critical syndromes
- The evaluation of patients presenting with one of 20 chief complaints
